

Enlisted Joint Professional Military Education (EJPME)

Developing confident and effective joint force leaders today to meet the complex military challenges of tomorrow.

The Joint Force Leader Development Branch (JFLD) serves to increase the readiness and capability of company grade/junior officers, Joint civilians, and enlisted personnel.

JFLD provides Chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff (CJCS)-sponsored, assignment-oriented educational opportunities for enlisted leaders serving in, or designated to serve in, joint and combined organizations.

The JFLD mission is to use advanced distributed learning practices and principles to educate and prepare joint warfighters from the enlisted force assigned to joint organizations to successfully support activities and supervise multiple Service members. Part of that mission is accomplished via the EJPME catalog of instruction.

The EJPME New Student Orientation course is a prerequisite to EJPME I and II, designed to prepare enlisted members for the associated academic rigors to successfully complete the program. This course outlines expectations students should consider prior to enrolling in EJPME I or II.

EJPME I and EJPME II are two separate curriculums.* EJPME I emphasizes curriculum commensurate with E5/E6 Joint Assignment responsibilities. EJPME II emphasizes curriculum commensurate with E7/E8/E9 Joint Assignment responsibilities.

EJPME I consists of 40+ hours of computer-based instruction with a focus on preparing enlisted leaders to successfully support joint activities, lead members from multiple Services, and better understand joint operations.

EJPME II is a 45+ hour advanced course restricted to paygrades E7 and above, plus civilian and multinational equivalents. This advanced course expands upon topics learned in EJPME I and introduces new, relevant, higher level joint course material. Students should complete EJPME I before taking EJPME II.

The courses are accessible online from anywhere across the globe, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Students have a total of 180 days to complete each curriculum.
